Corporate Prayer of Confession: Almighty God, You have called us to live a life of humility and service to others, yet too often we reject that call. Our pride, self-reliance, & selfishness leads us to be anxious instead of trusting You. Our worries about our needs prevent us from caring about other people's needs. We frequently disregard others because we do not have "enough time or resources." Instead of seeing the needs of others, we judge and critique them, while elevating ourselves. Forgive us Lord for our stubborn and proud hearts. Cause us to remember and dwell upon all that Jesus has done for us, moving us to joyfully and deliberately tying on the apron of humility each day, eager to serve as Jesus has served us. In His name we pray. Amen.

THE LORD COMMUNES WITH HIS PEOPLE

The climax of our worship is sitting at the Table with the Lord. We come to the Table full of thankfulness and joy because of His grace. As the perfect Lamb of God, Jesus' sacrifice reconciled us to the Father so that we are in a right relationship with him.

Words of Institution

Leader: Therefore, we proclaim the faith:

Unison: Christ has died! Christ has risen! Christ will come again!!!

Distribution of the Bread and Cup

Bread: Gluten-free bread is held in small bowls within each basket. Cup: Grape juice is in the clear cups; wine is in the tinted, purple cups.

What is Communion?

Communion is also known as the Lord's Supper. The bread represents the broken body of Christ, and the cup represents the blood Jesus poured out as the Sacrificial Lamb (see 1 Corinthians 11:23-26).

When we celebrate this feast, we commune with the risen Lord Jesus who stands as our host to offer spiritual nourishment, renewal and life. We also participate together in the reconciling grace of God.

Who can take Communion?

We warmly welcome to the table all who have publicly professed their faith in Jesus – trusting in His once-for-all sacrificial death upon the cross.

At Cypress Ridge, we ask children to wait to take communion until they have met with the elders to share their faith in Jesus

If you have not yet professed faith in Jesus, we encourage you to spend this time reflecting on the prayers below.

Prayer for those searching for the truth

Lord Jesus, You claim to be the way, truth and life. If what You claim is true, please guide me and teach me. Give me an understanding of who You are, and open up my heart so that I may have faith in You. Amen.

Prayer of faith

Lord Jesus, I admit that I am more sinful than I ever believed, but through You, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared to hope. I thank You for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross. Knowing that You have also been raised from the dead, I turn from my sins and receive You as my Savior. Amen.

THE LORD SENDS US OUT INTO THE WORLD

God does not save us simply from something. He saves us to something ... to be His messengers of redemption to a lost and fallen world. He sends us out redeemed, loved, and with a purpose. We are called to bear witness to what He is doing in our lives where we live, work, and play. Praise be to God!

Questions to Consider

- 1. Peter connects true greatness not with a crown, but with an apron. In what specific, practical ways does our culture teach the opposite? Where do you feel the pressure to seek a "crown" instead of putting on an "apron"?
- 2. This passage links anxiety directly to the pride of self-reliance. Can you share a recent situation where your anxiety or worry was fueled by a desire to control the outcome? What "idol" (control, approval, comfort, security) was at the root of that anxiety?
- 3. When we consider the "great exchange" on the cross, how does the truth that Jesus wore the "apron of your shame" so you could wear the "robe of His righteousness" change the way you view your failures and weaknesses?
- 4. Of the practical examples of "tying on the apron" (in moments of conflict, worry, service, etc.), which one is most challenging for you right now? What is one specific, practical step you can take this week to cast that care on God and, in response, humbly serve someone else?
